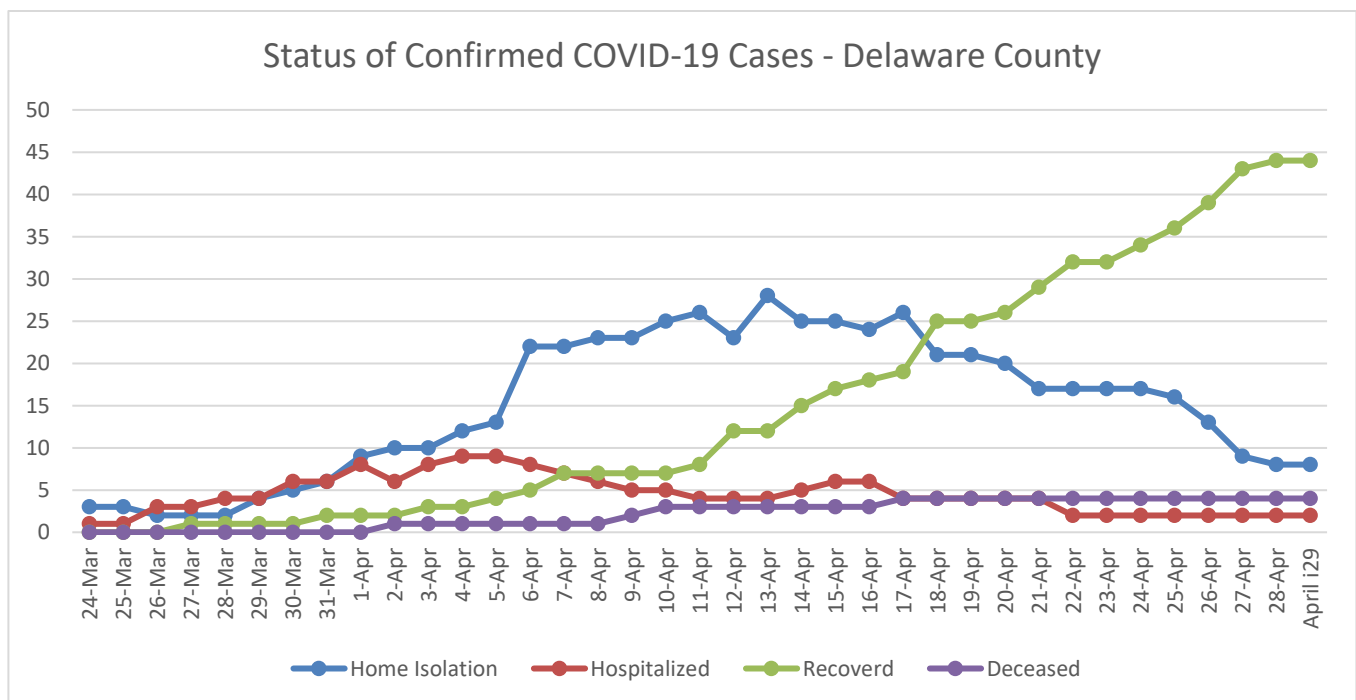

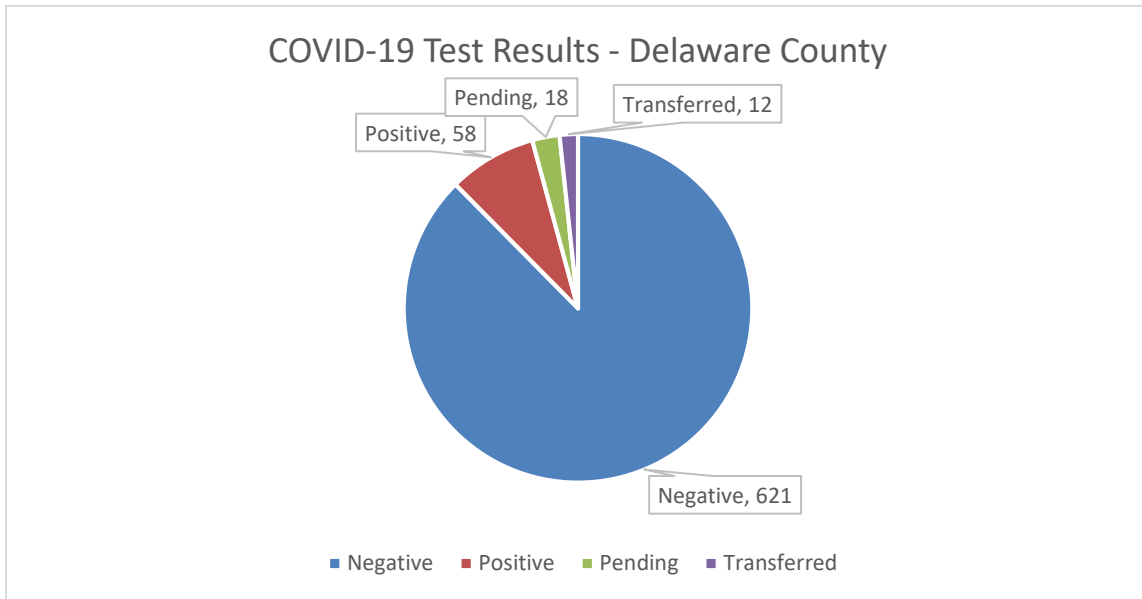
Delaware County is reporting one new case of COVID-19 reported to Delaware County today. That case was transferred to the county the person resides. This means with the increasing number of recoveries in relationship to the limited number of new cases in Delaware County there remains only 10 known active cases in the county.

To date there have been 70 confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 reported to Delaware County. There are an additional 22 people under mandatory quarantine and no people under precautionary quarantine. To date 714 people have been tested. Of those 621 results are negative and we are still waiting for results from 18 tests. Twelve (12) confirmed cases have been transferred out of the county. Of the 58 confirmed positive cases in Delaware County 2 are isolated and receiving medical care in a hospital, 8 are isolated and recovering safely at their homes, 4 people are deceased and 44 have fully recovered and are no longer in isolation. It is important to note confirmed cases does not mean the total number of potential cases in the County. Access to testing remains extremely limited, the number of confirmed cases does not reflect the current spread of COVID-19.

The following chart is a representation of positive cases since March 23, 2020.



The following pie chart illustrates the amount of testing and the results reported:



The following chart represents the total number of confirmed cases reported to Delaware County in relationship to the number of those cases that have been transferred, discharged from care, deceased and active cases of the disease. The number of known active cases as of today is 10, the number transferred is 12 and the number discharged is 44 while the number deceased remains 4.
