PRESS RELEASE September 7, 2020

Over this holiday weekend Delaware County reported three (3) new positive test results for COVID-19 and three (3) additional recoveries have been reported. The known active cases in the County as of today remains 6. To date there have been 114 confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in Delaware County, with 78 people now under mandatory quarantine and no one under precautionary quarantine. There have been 6814 negative results reported. As of today 6 people are isolated and receiving care at home and no one is isolated in the hospital, 6 people have died and 102 have fully recovered and are no longer isolated or receiving care.

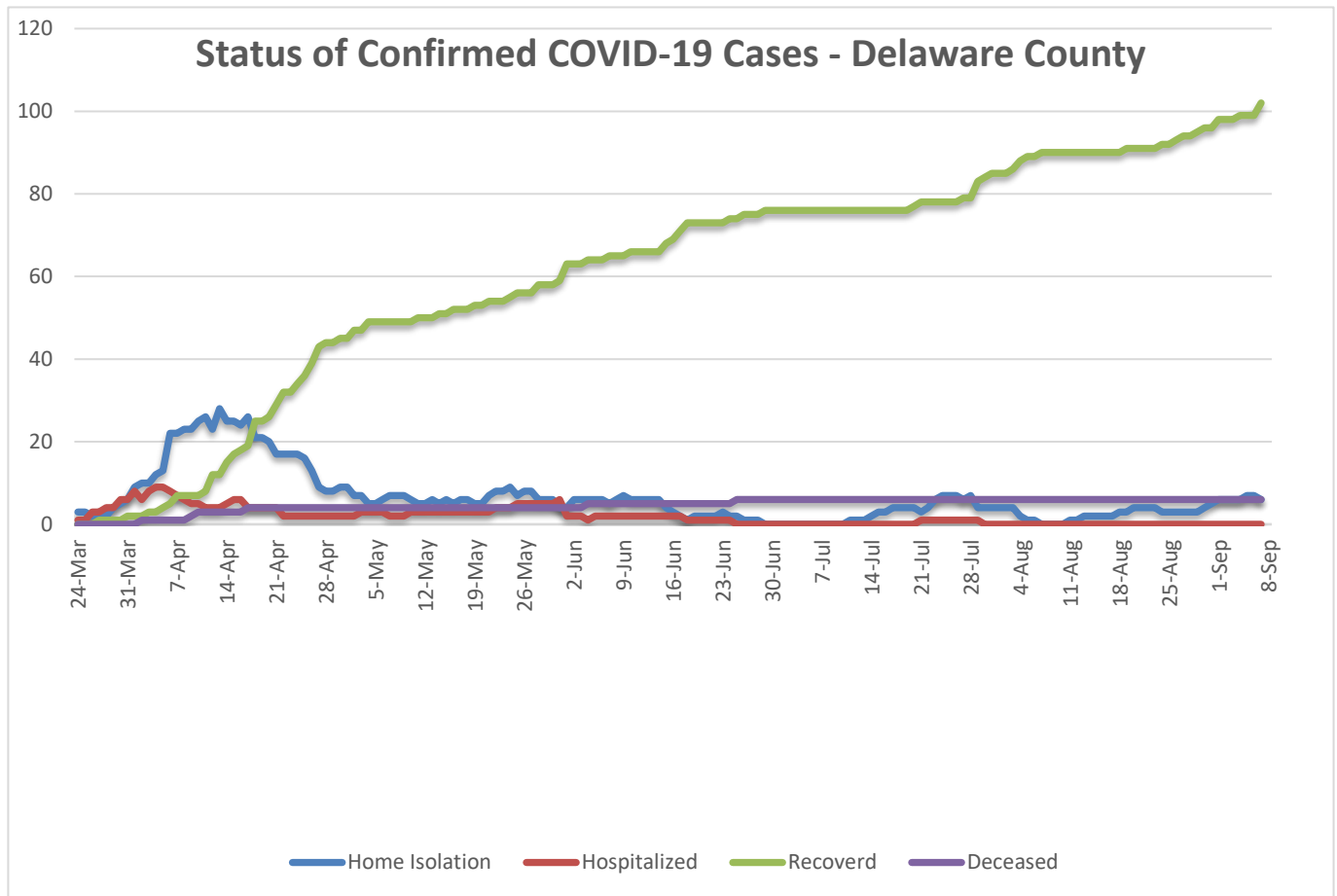
Since reopening, new positive cases have been reported at SUNY Delhi. The school is actively working with the Delaware County Public Health Office and the New York State Department of Health (NYS DOH). Public Health is actively conducting contact investigations, quarantining and isolating individuals residing in Delaware County. SUNY Delhi has developed a COVID-19 Dashboard found at <https://www.delhi.edu/covid19/covid19-dashboard.php>. This site will inform the SUNY Delhi campus and the community about new lab-confirmed COVID-19 cases involving SUNY Delhi students. Both Public Health and NYS DOH are monitoring the situation at SUNY Delhi closely to avoid additional community spread.

Delaware County Public Health and Planning are seeking information from all county gyms and fitness-related businesses in order to assist in their reopening, under the guidelines set forth by New York State. Facilities should contact the Delaware County Planning Department at 607-832-5444 to discuss reopening and schedule a review of the reopening plan and a site inspection.

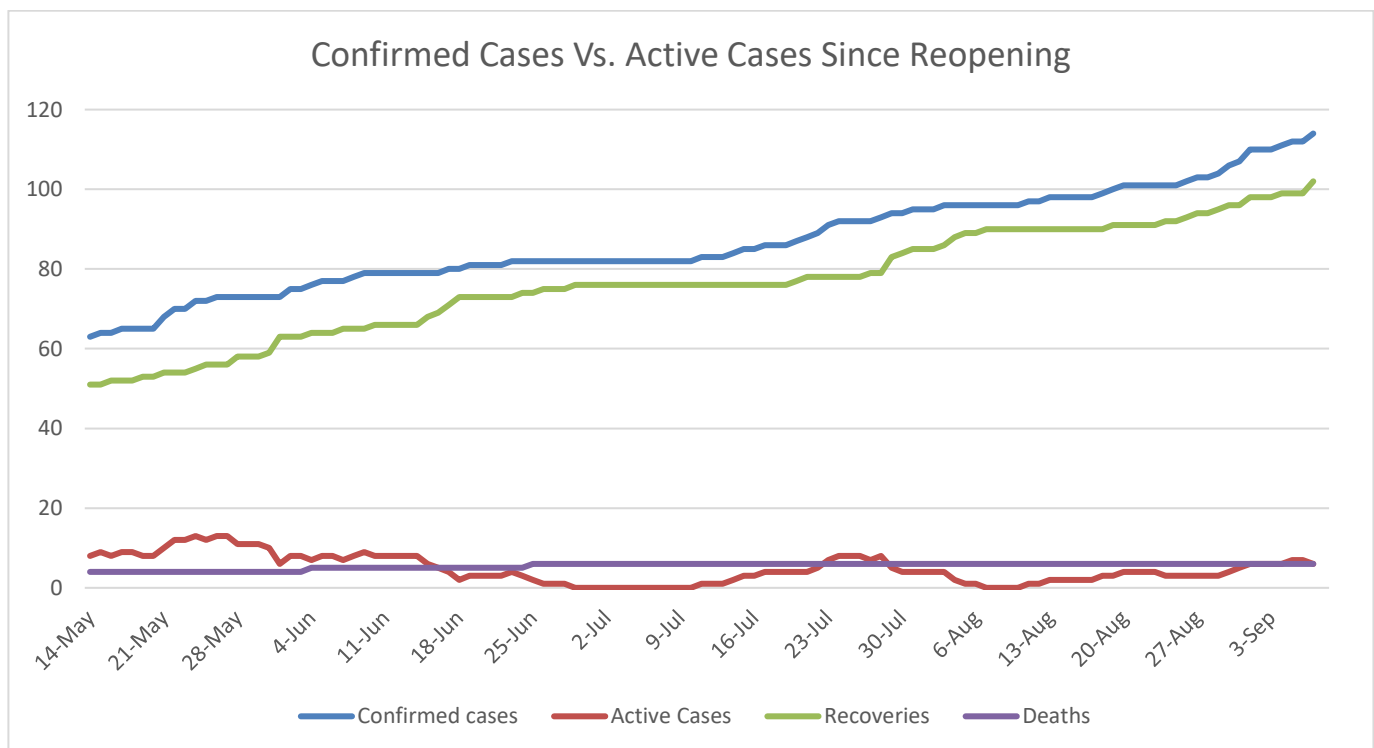

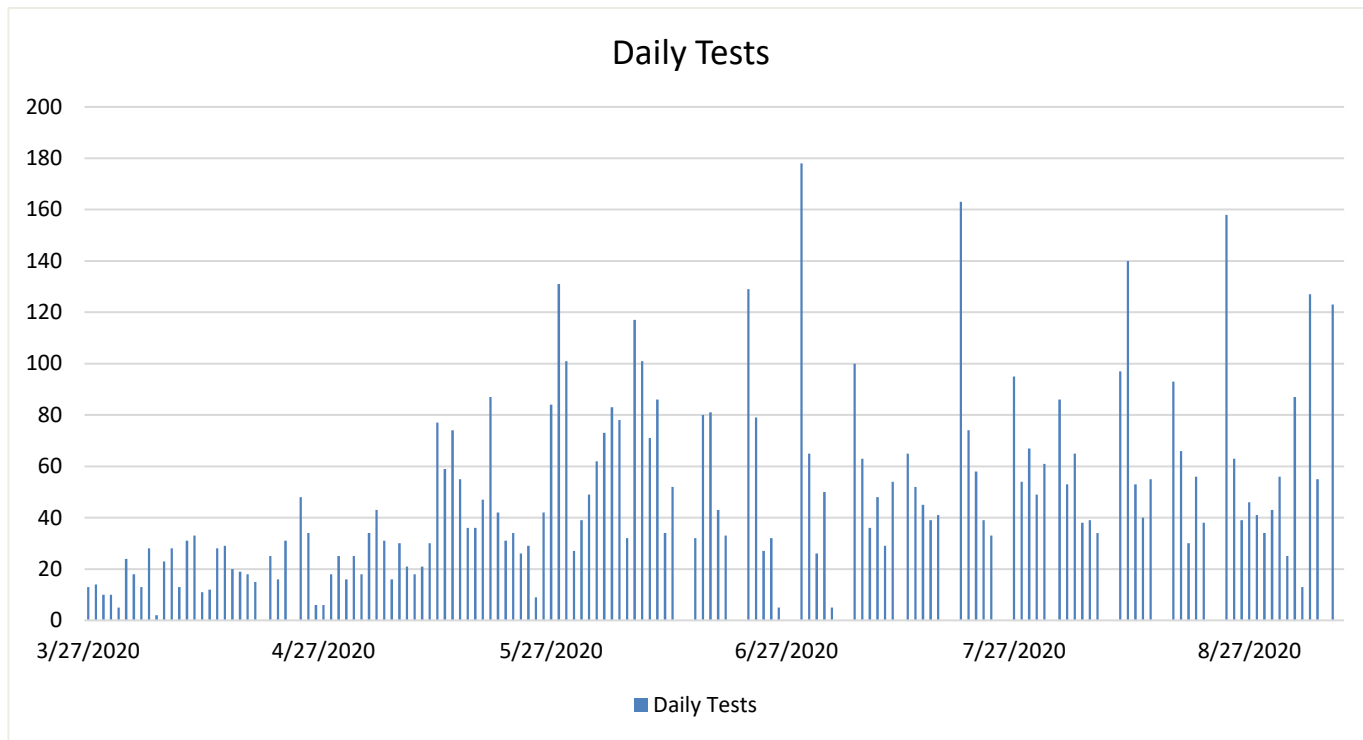
The following chart is a representation of positive cases since March 23, 2020.



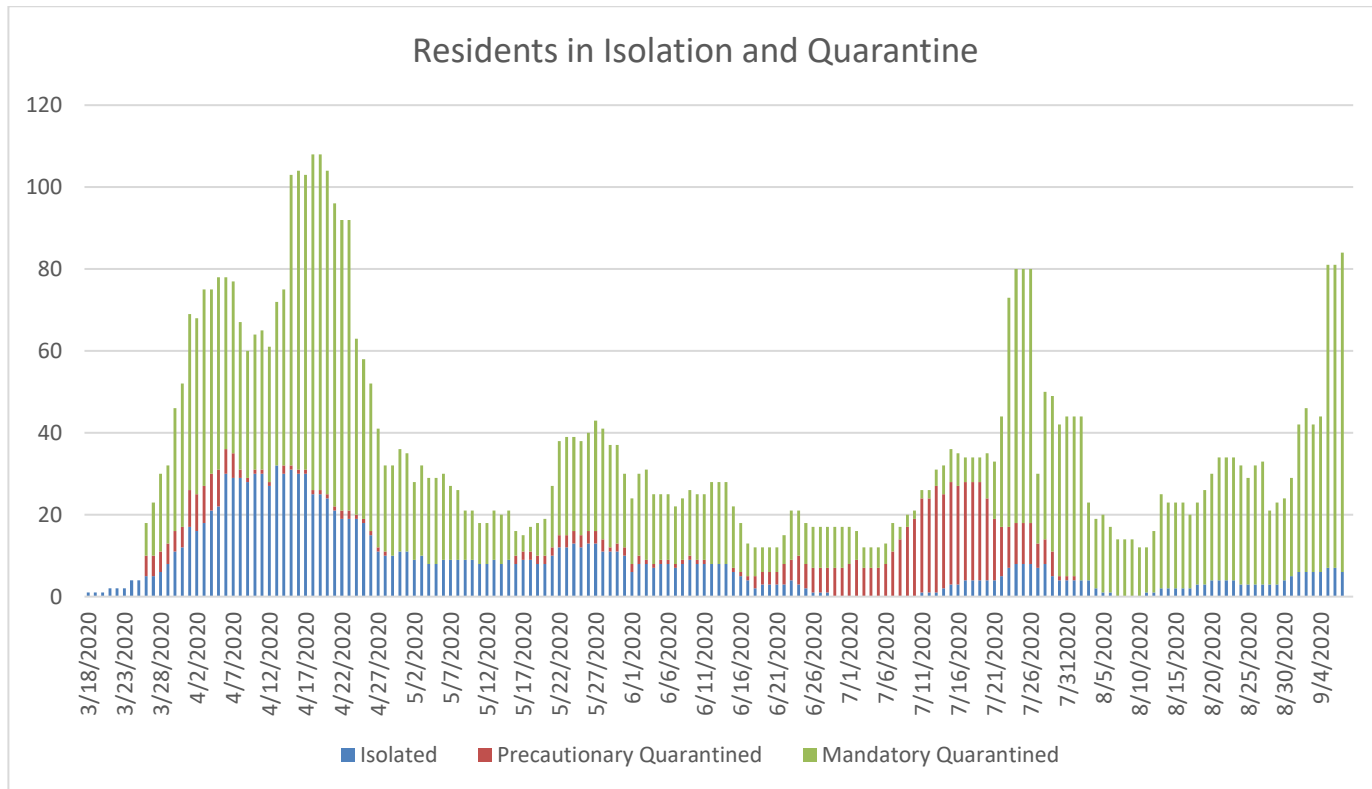
The following chart represents the number of cases since the beginning of our economic reopening Phase 1 on May 15, 2020. The numbers have remained fairly consistent with confirmed cases and recoveries rising slowly, keeping the number of active cases and deaths flat from day to day.



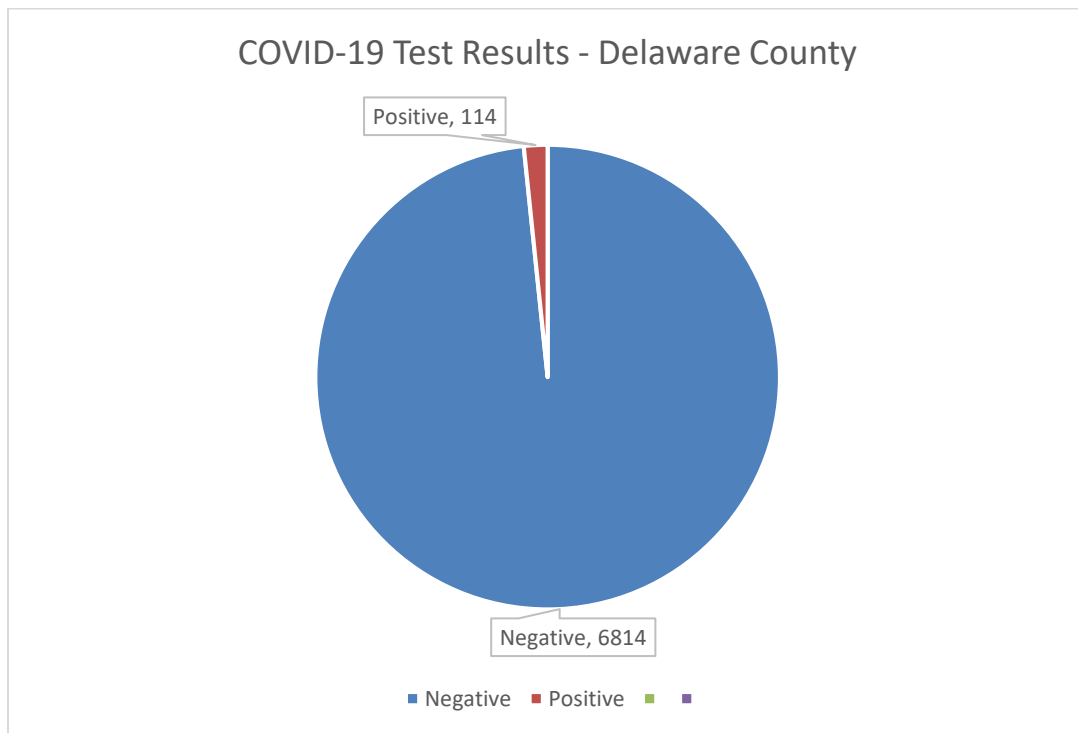
Delaware County remains vigilant in testing residents with 6956 people tested to date. Currently 15.45% of the total population has been tested with test results being reported every day. The following chart represents the total number of new daily tests since March 26, 2020.



Another important measure that we need to be conscious of are the residents that have been placed under mandatory or precautionary quarantine. The following chart shows the number of residents quarantined and isolated.

The following chart represents the total number of confirmed cases in Delaware County in relationship to the number of those cases that have been discharged from care, deceased and active cases of the disease. The number of known active cases as of today is 6 and the number discharged is 102 while the number deceased is 6.
