PRESS RELEASE September 29, 2020

Governor Cuomo announced today that the State will be sending rapid testing machines to areas that are seeing a rise in COVID-19 cases. In the Southern Tier Broome, Chemung and Steuben counties have been reporting increases above the state average and are areas that will receive the rapid testing sites. As reported by the local news feed the spike in Broome County is traced to a local pub, the spike in Chemung County is traced back to a church function and the spike in Steuben County is traced back to an adult care facility. The Governor also announced he will be working with various religious groups to find ways to worship safely and identify practices that can lend themselves to possible spread of the disease.

Delaware County is reporting no new cases of COVID-19 today. The known active cases in the County as of today remains 4. To date there have been 121 confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in Delaware County, with 22 people now under mandatory quarantine and no one under precautionary quarantine. As of today three (3) people are isolated and receiving care at home and one (1) person is isolated in the hospital, 7 people have died and 110 have fully recovered and are no longer isolated or receiving care.

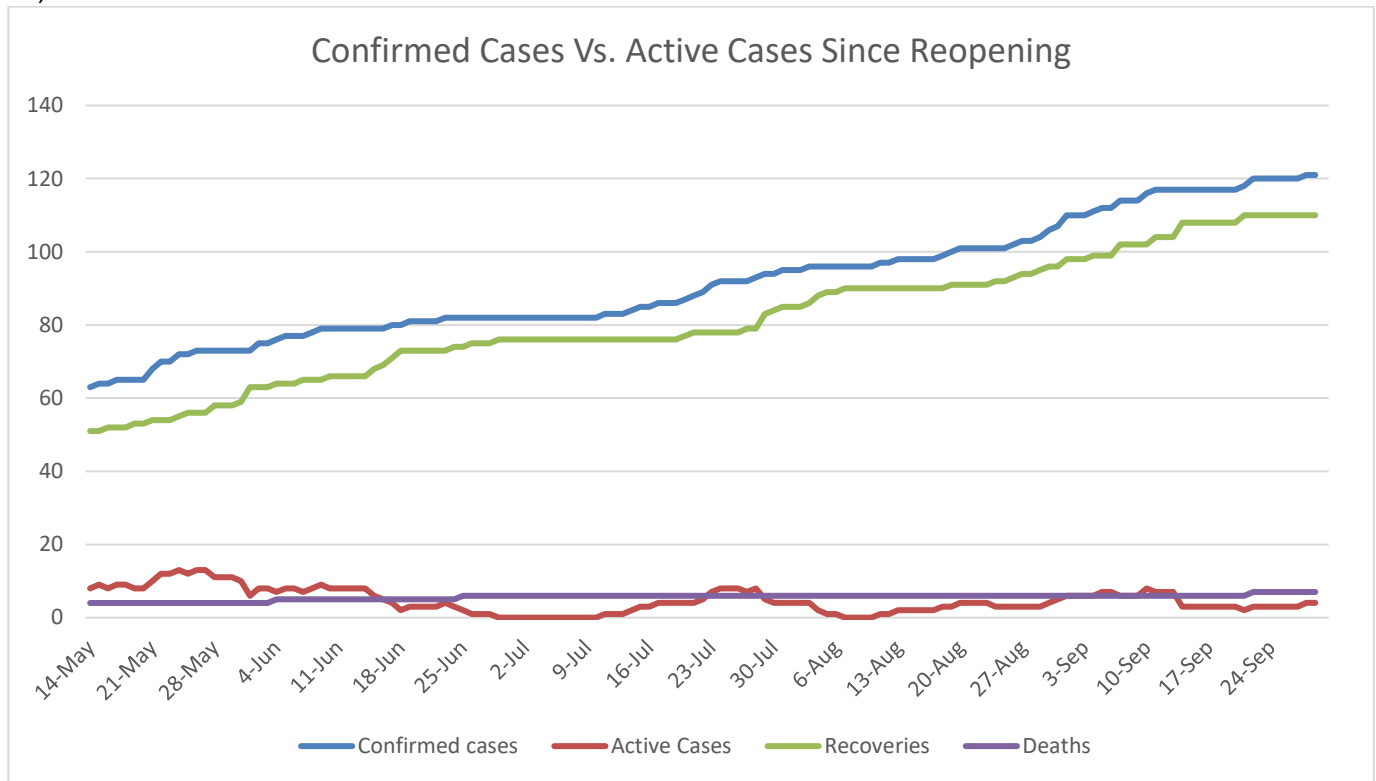

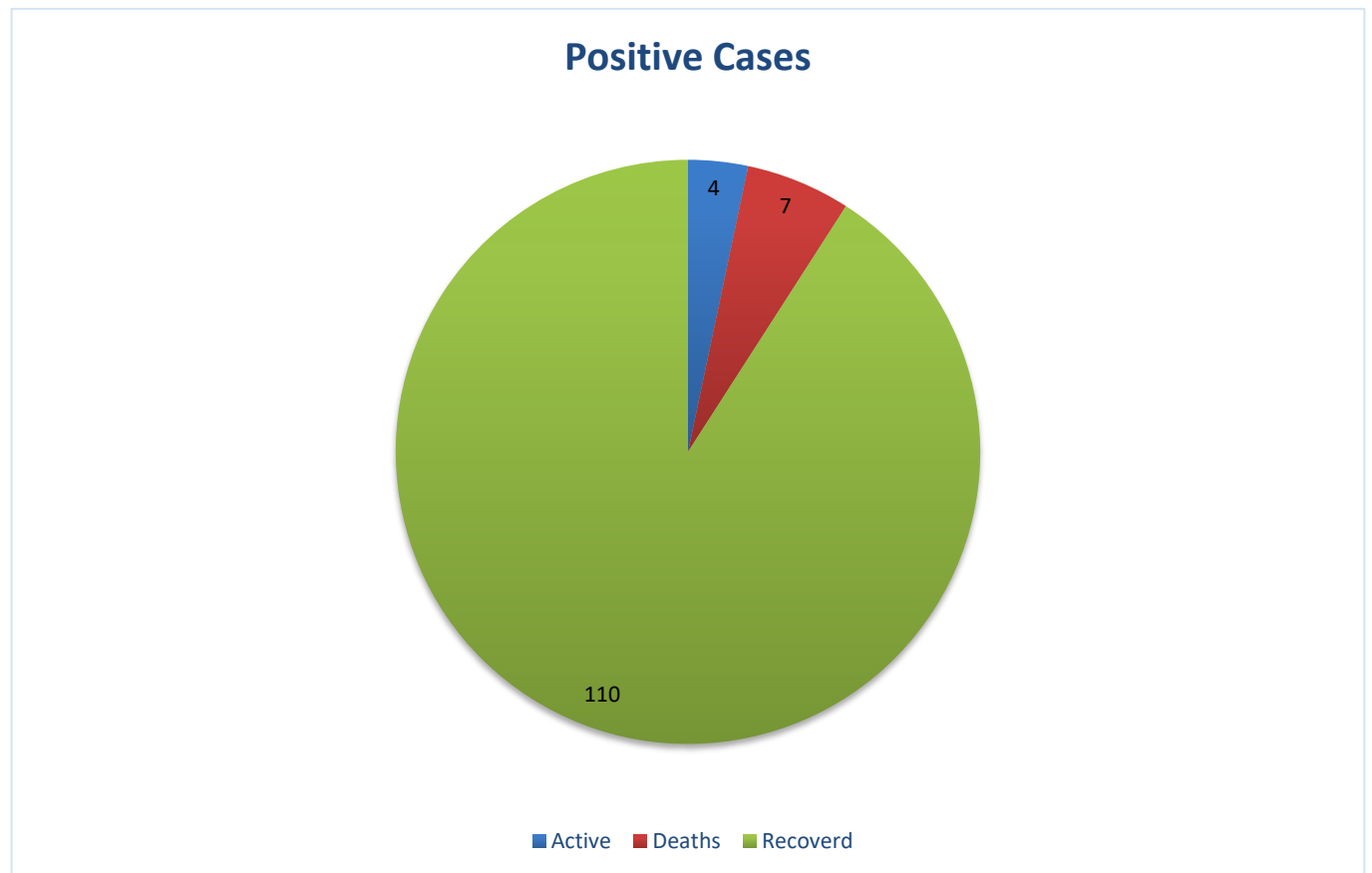

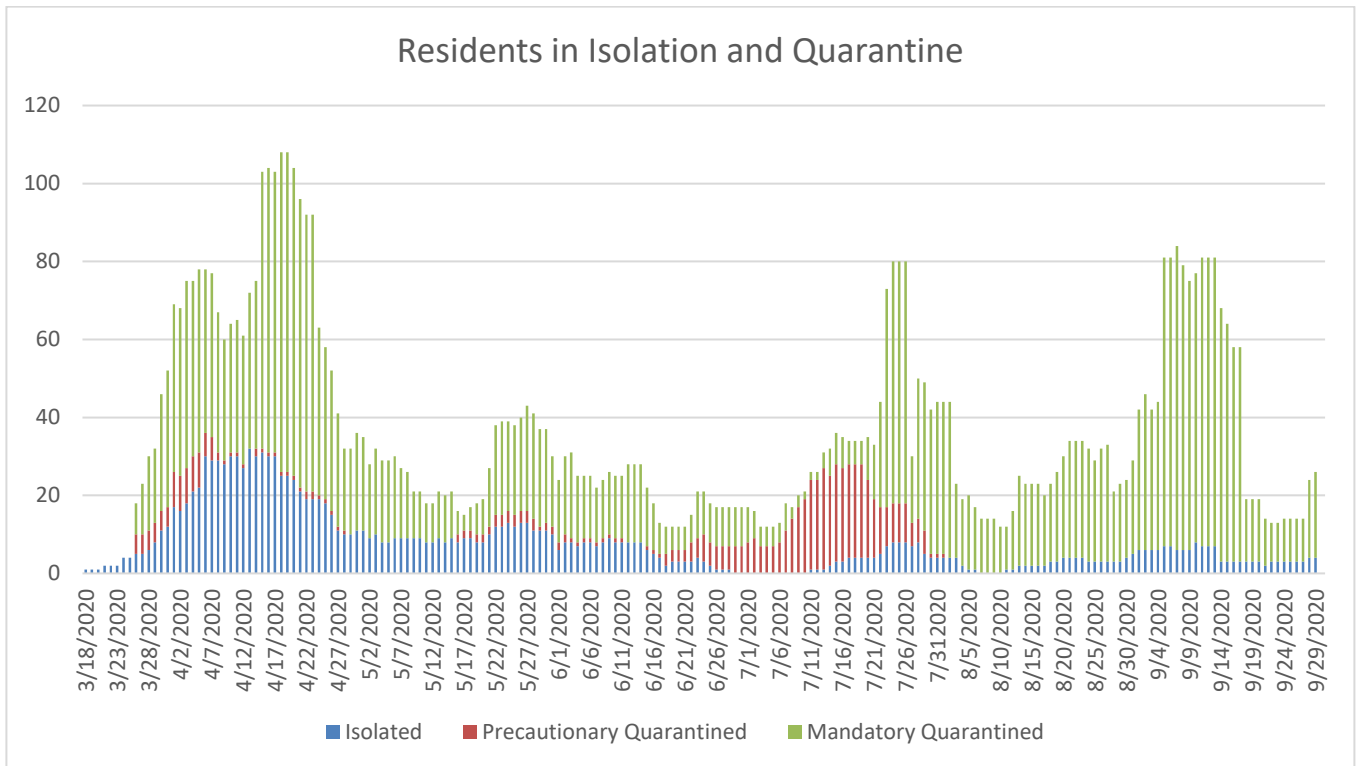
The following chart represents the number of cases since the beginning of our economic reopening Phase 1 on May 15, 2020.
