PRESS RELEASE October 20, 2020

Delaware County is currently seeing an increase in COVID 19 cases. The curves are remaining flat as there have been several recoveries reported as well as new cases. Delaware County Public Health posts a daily dashboard to show how many new cases and recoveries are reported each day. You can find the dashboard posted to the Delaware County webpage at www.co.delaware.ny.us

Delaware County is reporting two (2) new cases of COVID-19 today. The known active cases in the County as of today is now 12. To date there have been 145 confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in Delaware County, with 69 people now under mandatory quarantine and no one under precautionary quarantine. As of today ten (10) people are isolated and receiving care at home and two (2) people are isolated in the hospital, 8 people have died and 125 have fully recovered and are no longer isolated or receiving care.

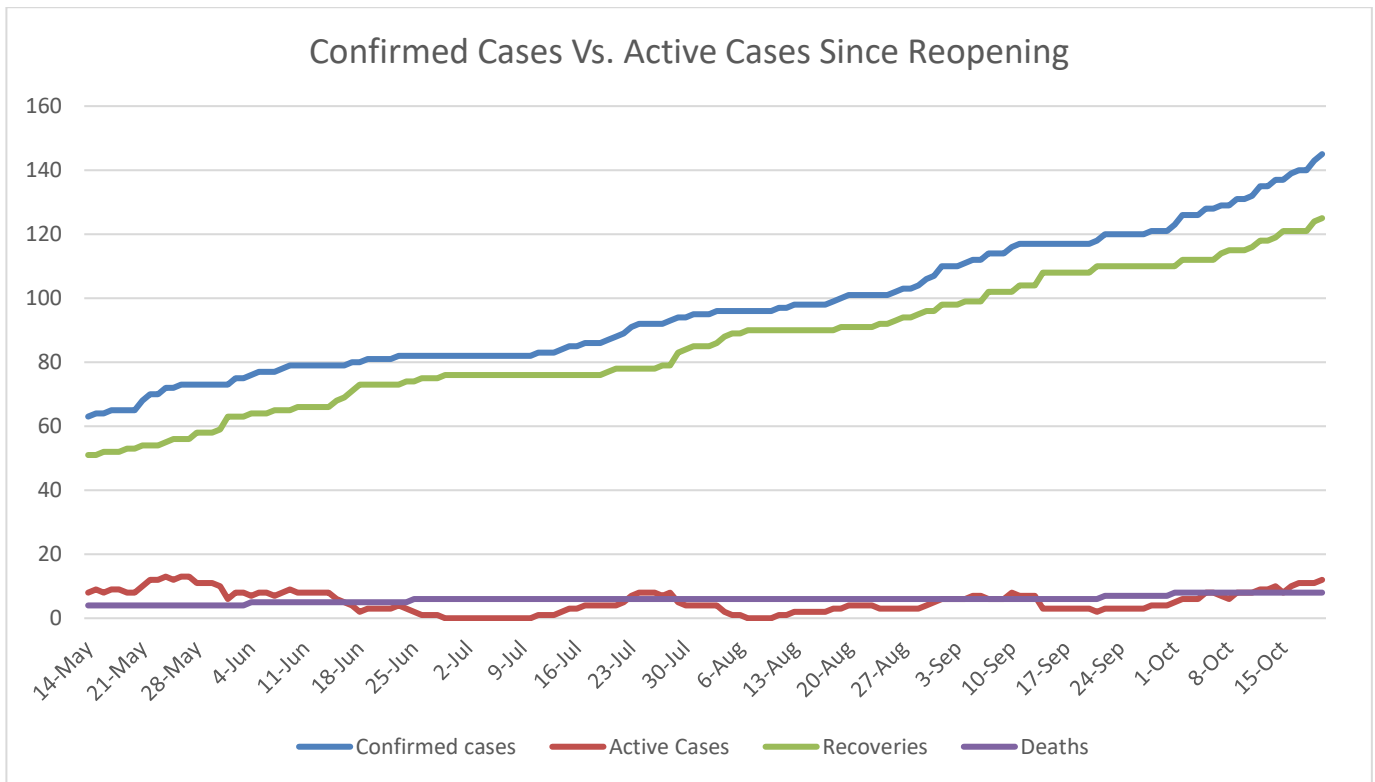

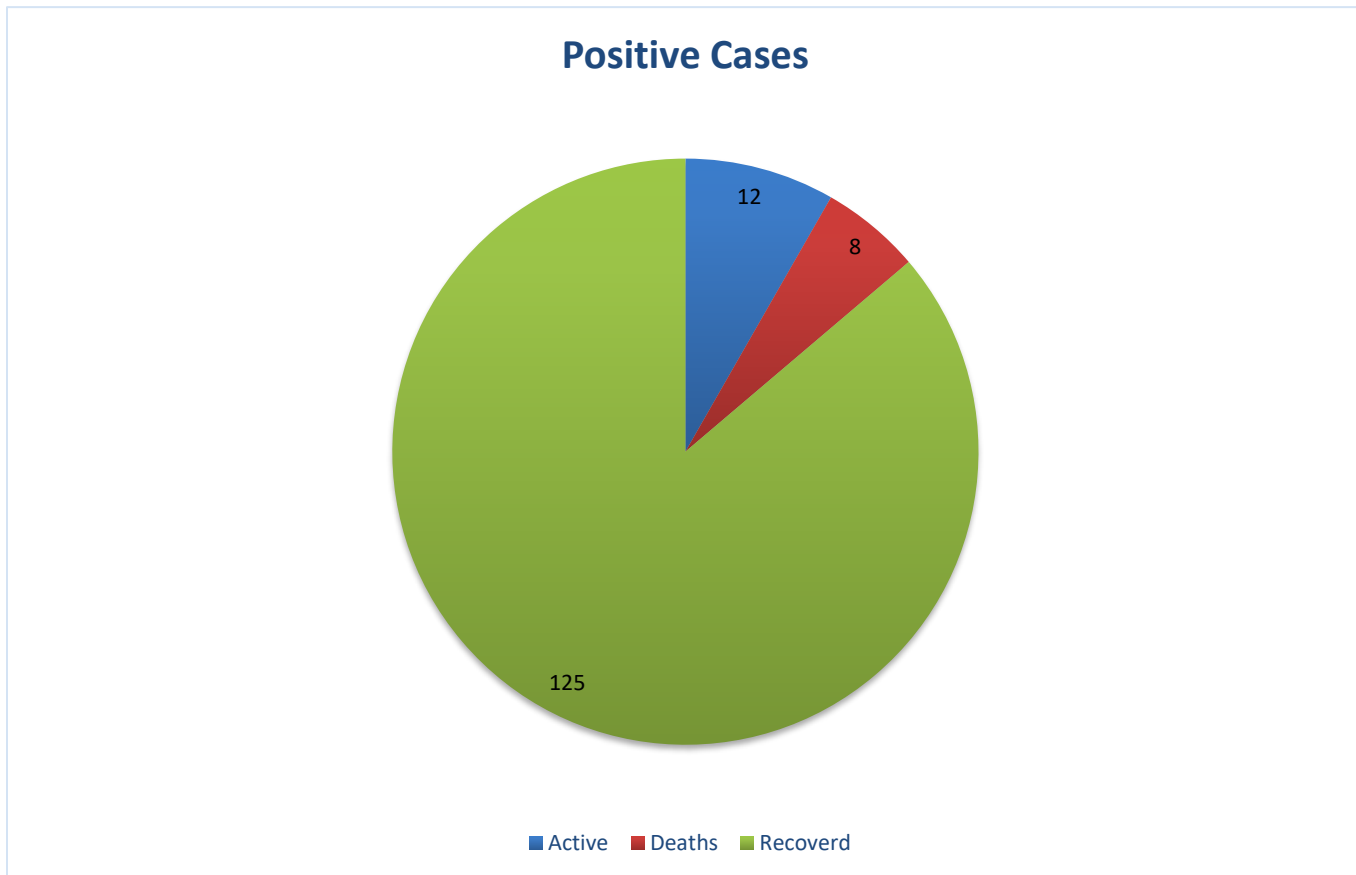
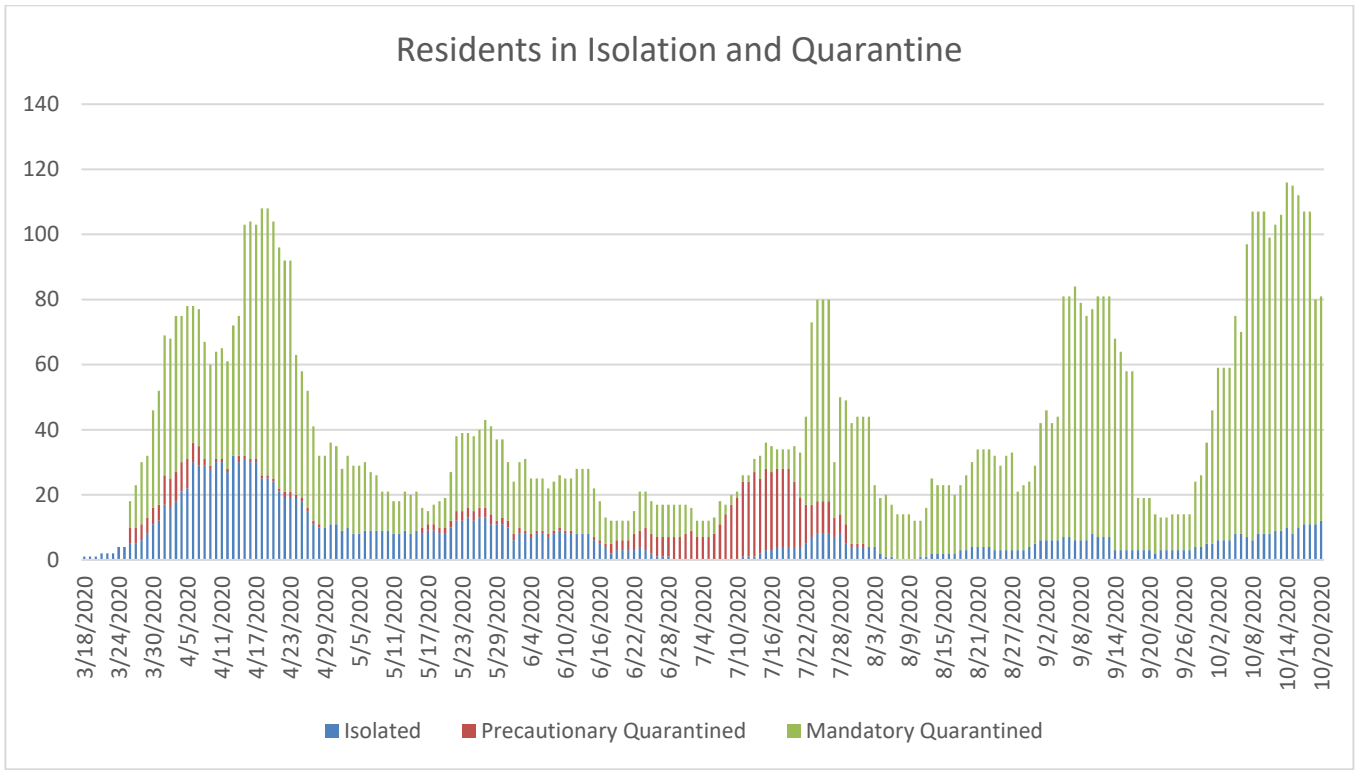
