Delaware County is experiencing an increase in COVID-19 cases across the county. It is imperative that we continue to practice social distancing, wear face coverings when out in public, and wash your hands regularly. As the weather turns colder and we are spending more time in doors these practices are even more important. The numbers in Delaware County are increasing and we are working diligently to get this recent outbreak under control. Delaware County Public Health posts a daily dashboard to show how many new cases and recoveries are reported each day. You can find the dashboard posted to the Delaware County webpage at:

Delaware County is reporting nine (9) new cases of COVID-19 today. The known active cases in the County as of today is now 52. To date there have been 215 confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 in Delaware County, with 194 people now under mandatory quarantine and no one under precautionary quarantine. As of today 45 people are isolated and receiving care at home and seven (7) people are isolated in the hospital, 9 people have died and 154 have fully recovered and are no longer isolated or receiving care.

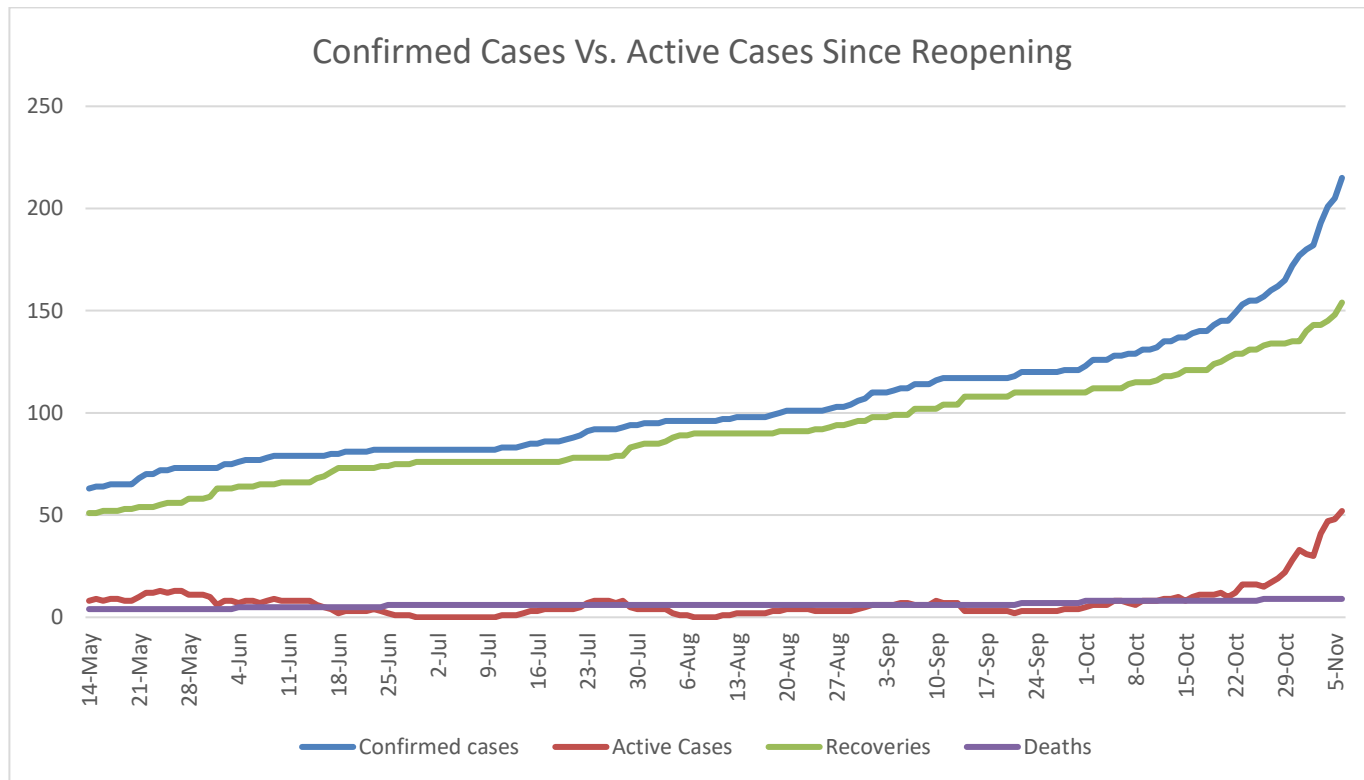

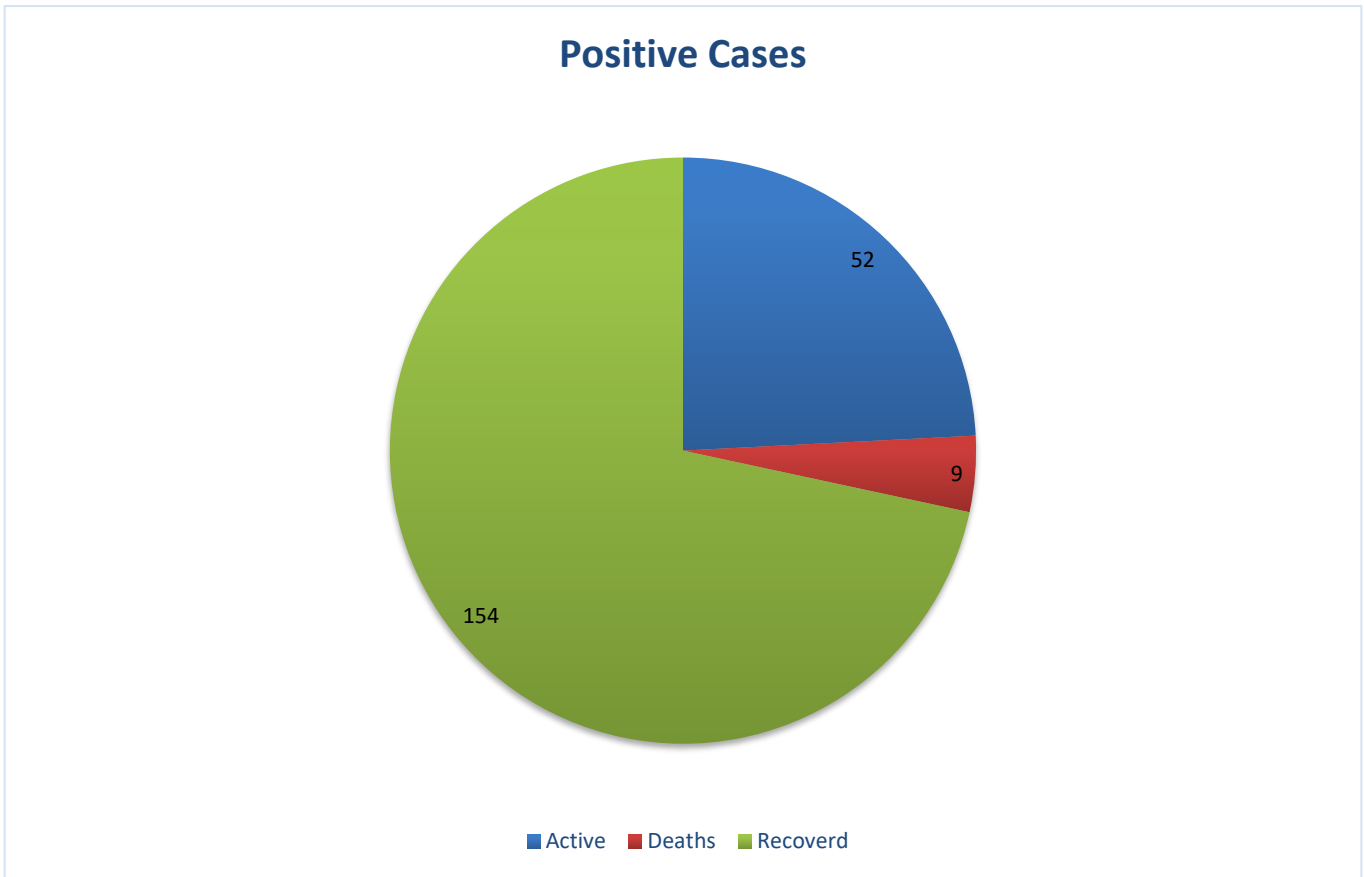
